Luke 13:1-5 – At that very time there were some present who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. ²He asked them, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans?" ³No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. ⁴Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them--do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem?" ⁵No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did."

Two Scenarios

- 1) Pilate kills some Galileans and their blood gets mixed with the blood of their sacrifices (v 1)
- 2) The Tower of Siloam falls and kills 18 people (v 4a)

Same _____ – "Do you think that ... they were worse sinners/offenders than all the other Galileans/Jerusalemites?" (vv 2, 4b)

Job 4:7-8 – "Think now, who that was innocent ever perished? Or where were the upright cut off?" ⁸As I have seen, those who plow iniquity and sow trouble reap the same."

Same _____ – "No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as/just as they did" (vv 3, 5)

John 9:1-3 – As he walked along, he saw a man blind from birth. ²His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" ³Jesus answered, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned; he was born blind so that God's works might be revealed in him."

Luke 13:6-9 – Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. ⁷So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?' ⁸He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. ⁹If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'"

Isaiah 5:1-2 – Let me sing for my beloved my love-song concerning his vineyard: My beloved had a vineyard on a very fertile hill. ²He dug it and cleared it of stones, and planted it with choice vines; he built a watchtower in the midst of it, and hewed out a wine vat in it; he expected it to yield grapes, but it yielded wild grapes.

Luke 4:18-19 – "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, ¹⁹to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

The means of grace – Scripture, prayer, worship, Lord's Supper, holy conferencing, acts of mercy – become ways by which God nourishes us toward fruitful living
