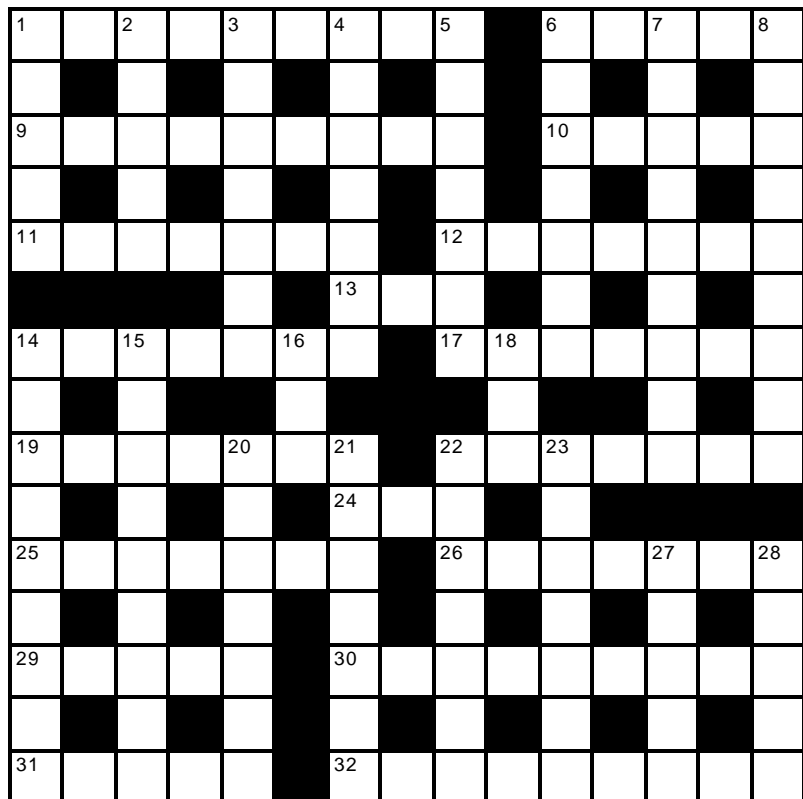

## Across

### 1 A-PP-LI-CAN'T

A priest (A PP) that takes lithium (LI) cannot (CAN'T) be = APPLICANT: a candidate.

### 6 WICKS

With Smith (SMITH) they get a light (WICKS) = SMITHWICKS: beer.

### 9 TIPPERARY

See a "piper try a" new arrangement = TIPPERARY: it's a long way to go.

### 10 C-AB-IN

See (C) a sailor (AB) in (IN) = CABIN: the room at sea.

### 11 CAR-MINE

That's not your vehicle! (CAR MINE!) = CARMINE: red.

### 12 T(ALLY)-HO

Though briefly (T-HO) around an ally (ALLY) = TALLY-HO: that cries at the hunt.

### 13 MNO

The letters on the number 6 on a keypad of a phone.

### 14 WH-IS-KEY

Westmeath (WH) is (IS) key (KEY) for = WHISKEY: the spirit.

### 17 NEW-BORN

Something very, very young is NEWBORN, and a NEW arrangement of BORN gives "N or B".

### 19 THEOREM

"Me or the" twisted = THEOREM: a proposition.

### 22 BESIEGE

The poor "beg I see" = BESIEGE: and crowd around.

### 24 AD-O

After the year 1 B.C. maybe one has the year A.D. 0 = ADO: the fuss.

### 25 RAKE'S IN

The hoe's out of the garden (RAKE'S IN) = RAKES IN: gathers.

### 26 L(EVER)ET

Let outside (L-ET) ever (EVER) is = LEVERET: the rabbit-like.

### 29 OUTER

A circuitous "route" = OUTER: away from the centre.

### 30 INTENS-I'VE

Played "tennis" (INTENS) before I've (IVE) = INTENSIVE: concentrated.

### 31 DI-RGE

Diana (DI) confused "Reg" (RGE) = DIRGE: lament.

### 32 HO(ROSCO)PE

In hope (HO-PE) Rosco lives (ROSCO) = HOROSCOPE: forecasting the future.

### 1 ANTIC

So barmy "can it" be = ANTIC: a prank.

### 2 PA-PER

One father (PA) for each (PER) = PAPER: Times maybe.

### 3 IC-E RI-NK

I se (IC) you backed Ireland, 'IRE' (ERI) and North Korea (NK) = ICE RINK: for the hockey.

### 4 ACADEMY

"Day came" maybe = ACADEMY: a school.

## 5 TRY IT ON

Half the gen-try (TRY) take just one (I) ton (T-ON) = TRY IT ON: to see how it looks.

## 6 WICK-LOW

The candle doesn't burn long, because the WICK is LOW = WICKLOW: around Hollywood.

## 7 CUB-BYHOLE

Somewhere snug for the lion CUB = CUBBYHOLE.

## 8 SUN LOUNGE

Has lots of windows, and the room to catch the rays.

## 14 WATER-FOR-D

H2O (WATER) for D (FOR D) = WATERFORD: CO (county)

## 15 ICE SKATER

"Creakiest" alternative = ICE SKATER: found in an ICE RINK

## 16 EVE

A-dam's better half = EVE.

## 18 EYE

Point of view = EYE: a pirate often only has one.

## 20 RE-SERVE

After the (tennis) foot fault perhaps (RE-SERVE) = RESERVE: coolness of manner.

## 21 M(ANN-IS)H

In Meath (M-H) Ann is (ANN IS) = MANNISH: butch.

## 22 BOLSTER

Wild "lobster" = BOLSTER: on the (sea) bed.

## 23 SA-VIN-G-S

South African (SA) and French wine (VIN) that's a good (G) second (S) = SAVINGS: set aside for a rainy day.

## 27 RHINO

Wild, an anagram, one with a horn (I HORN) = RHINO: wild one.

## 28 THESE

The southeast (THE SE) = THESE: more than this (the plural of "this").
