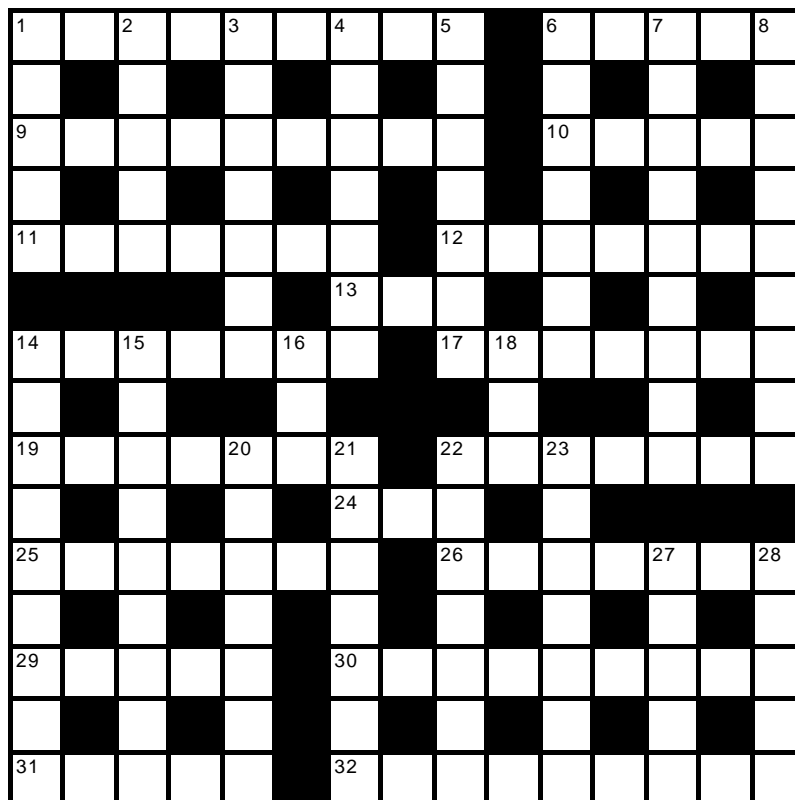

## Across

- 1 TEAK-ETTLE  
Hardwood (TEAK) s-ettle-s, without ends (ETTLE) = TEAKETTLE: found in the kitchen.
- 6 GUS-TO  
Get Augustus (GUS) to (TO) show = GUSTO: some spirit.
- 9 MONT BLANC  
Used to write (MONT BLANC pen) = MONT BLANC: in the Alps.
- 10 S-EINE  
A second (S) one for the Germans (EINE) = SEINE: in Paris.
- 11 SPL-URGE  
Put back the LPs (SPL) before you get the urge (URGE) = SPLURGE: spend the money.
- 12 T(RACK)ER  
In-ter (T-ER) rack (RACK) = TRACKER: the one following the other.
- 13 ZEE

## 23 SURPASS

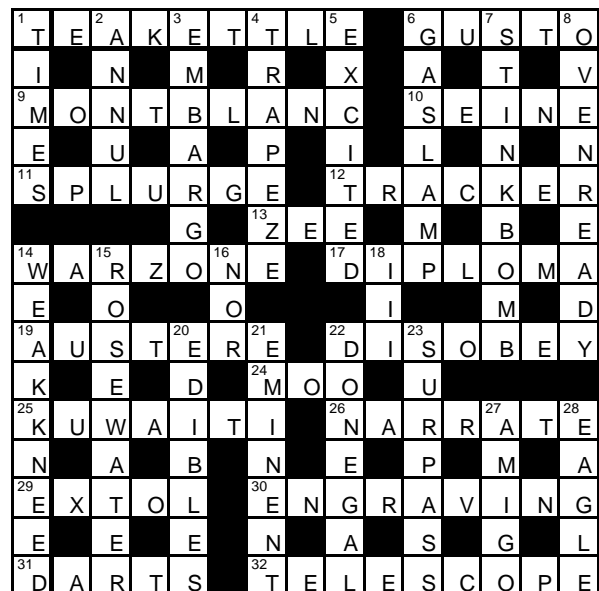
The knight (SIR) overtake (PASS) = SIR PASS, soundly = SURPASS: outdo.
