- Met to discuss the sufficiency of Tabors current SASH policy, communication and procedures on the 4th and 18th of May.
- Background work for these meetings was conducted by the Dean of Students and the Project Administrator.
- Work outside of the meetings was also conducted by other members of the task group.
- Benchmarked own current policy and procedures against University comparisons and made further recommendations.
- Ensured that the report form could be easily found by students on the front page of Tabor Online.
- Separated SASH form from the critical incidents form, recognising that these are very different items.
- Created an option for the reportee to be anonymous, recognising that the need for sensitivity and confidentiality is important.
- Created a better landing page for include SASH and critical incidents with student
- Created a space for third-party reporting.
- Arranged SASH training for one staff member and one student leader from each campus.
- Created a SASH orientation pack for students to be taken through on first week of attending Tabor.
- Determined a schedule for staff SASH training.
- Updated the policy to include a clearer definition of SASH.
- Modified Respect Now Always webpage according to above actions.
- Developed the "How it Works" flowchart.
